Results of partners' stocktake: March 2007

This paper sets out the results of the stocktake carried out by Core Group partners in March 2007. The purpose of the stocktake was to help us identify gaps in activity and inform the development of partnership actions for the new community plan.

For each of the six community plan themes this paper identifies some of the ways partners are already contributing to the priorities for the next Wychavon community plan through their current activities and business plans. It also includes suggestions for new partnership actions for the next community plan and some of the actions that partners are already planning.
