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1. Introduction



Background

West Mercia Constabulary, West Mercia Police Authority and their partners engaged Priority Research to conduct the 2006 Annual Crime and Community Safety Partnership survey.

The purpose of the survey was to collect data that will be used by the Constabulary, the Authority and their partners to help inform the planning and delivery of services and the future deployment of resources.

The questionnaire was based upon the previous survey in 2005, therefore where possible any changes in perception were tracked between the two. Throughout the survey report, 2006 results are presented in colour, whilst results from 2005 are in grey.

In addition to this report, two separate reports are available that allow for comparison at the South Worcestershire Basic Command Unit (BCU) and West Mercia Force levels.

Aims and objectives

The main objective was to assess current opinion regarding:

- The Police
- Fear of crime
- Perceived problems in people's neighbourhoods
- Experience of crime (inc reporting)
- Anti-social behaviour
- Drugs misuse
- Neighbourhood and community issues
- Road safety
- Keeping informed about the Police and Crime & Disorder issues
- Other District specific topics

The survey

The survey was posted to a random selection of 3800 district residents during July 2006. A freepost envelope was included so that the returns would be delivered directly to Priority Research Limited (PRL), thereby ensuring anonymity. In addition, the survey was available online.

A free prize draw and postcard reminder were also used to encourage the response rate. A sample of 1050 residents successfully completed and returned questionnaires by the closing date, a response rate of 27%.

To ensure the results were as representative as possible, the data was weighted by ward, age, gender and ethnicity. Therefore all results are reported for this weighted sample (weighted base: 1049).

Readers should take care when considering percentage results from some of the sub groups within the main sample, as the base figures may sometimes be small. In addition, due to weighting and rounding effects, some graphs may not add up to 100%.

Unless otherwise stated, all statistically significant differences are reported at the 95% confidence level. Therefore, a difference between two groups is usually considered statistically significant if chance could explain it only 5% of the time or less.

2. Summary of main findings

Experience of the police

Overall, 43% of Wychavon residents said that the police were doing a good or excellent job in their local district, compared to 45% in 2005 and 40% across the Force as a whole. A further 33% believed that the police were doing a fair job, whilst 18% believed that the police were performing poorly.

There was some variation in these results by ward, with over 55% of those living in Drakes Broughton, Droitwich South East and Little Hampton stating that the police do a good or an excellent job, whilst fewer than 25% of respondents in Broadway & Wickhamford, Bretforten & Offenham and Inkberrow felt the same.

The main reason given for these answers was a lack of perceived police presence or visibility. Since 2005, the proportion who had seen a uniformed Police Officer or Community Support Officer on average at least once a month, fell from 52% to 42%. Figures across the district ranged from 65% or more in the more densely populated wards such as Droitwich East, Evesham North, Bengeworth and Great Hampton, to less than 20% in the more rural areas of Pinvin, Upton Snodsbury, Bredon and Inkberrow.

Across the district there had been a significant reduction in how many residents considered the frequency with which they saw a Police Officer or CSO to be acceptable, from 56% in 2005 to 46% in 2006. Again, this figure varied by a similar pattern, with Norton & Whittington (64%), Evesham North, Great Hampton (both 62%) and Droitwich South West (59%) being the most positive, compared to Broadway & Wickhamford (23%), Bretforten & Offenham (19%) and Bredon (11%) who were the least positive.

Fear of crime

Around half of respondents remembered at least one specific episode in the previous 12 months when they had worried about becoming a victim of crime, which was consistent with the force as a whole. This was more prevalent in Evesham North (70%), Bredon (69%) and Droitwich Central (65%) than in wards such as South Bredon Hill, Elmley Castle & Somerville and Badsey (all under 35%). The most common concerns were:

- Burglary dwelling (31%)
- Vandalism/criminal damage (29%)
- Theft from vehicle (27%)
- Drunken disorder (20%)

Fear of crime had reduced significantly since the equivalent survey in 2005, in particular in relation to property crime. Nevertheless, amongst those who were fearful, 75% claimed that it had some impact on their life.

The vast majority of respondents felt safe in their neighbourhood or district during the day (98% & 96% respectively). Most respondents also still felt safe after dark (81% and 72% respectively).

Residents in Droitwich West, Bengeworth and Evesham South (all under 65% safe) felt more fearful in the neighbourhood after dark when compared to wards such as Bowbrook, Norton & Whittington and Upton Snodsbury where 95% or more felt safe.

Experience of crime

Amongst survey respondents, experience of crime had fallen significantly from 16% in 2005 to 12% in 2006; this reflects the trend across the force. The most commonly experienced crime was vandalism/criminal damage (5%). Reported levels of victimisation were highest in Bengeworth (30%), Bretforten & Offenham (28%), Droitwich Central (24%) and Ombersley (23%).

Community Priorities

Amongst survey respondents, the issues in their neighbourhood that were most commonly cited in the top four that needed to be addressed first were:

- Speeding traffic (28%)
- Drug dealing (20%)
- Vandalism, graffiti or criminal damage (18%)
- Burglary (18%)

Speeding traffic was a particularly high priority in Drakes Broughton (63%), Hartlebury (57%) and The Littletons (56%), whilst drug dealing was a higher priority in the Evesham wards of Bengeworth, Little Hampton and Evesham North (all 34%+). Tackling vandalism was particularly important to respondents in Dodderhill (43%) and Bredon (37%), with burglary being a much higher priority in Upton Snodsbury (50%) and South Bredon Hill (40%).

Anti-social behaviour (ASB)

Around half of the sample believed that ASB was very or fairly serious in the district (49%), although only a quarter (22%) said that the same was true about their neighbourhood. ASB was a more serious problem in the neighbourhoods of Bredon (56%), Bengeworth (44%), Bowbrook (43%) and Droitwich West (43%).

Illegal drugs misuse

Around half also believed that illegal drugs misuse was a problem in the District (54%), with a third saying the same about their neighbourhood (32%). By ward, illegal drugs misuse was rated as most serious in Bengeworth (73%), Droitwich West (51%), Evesham South, Dodderhill and Pershore (all 50%).



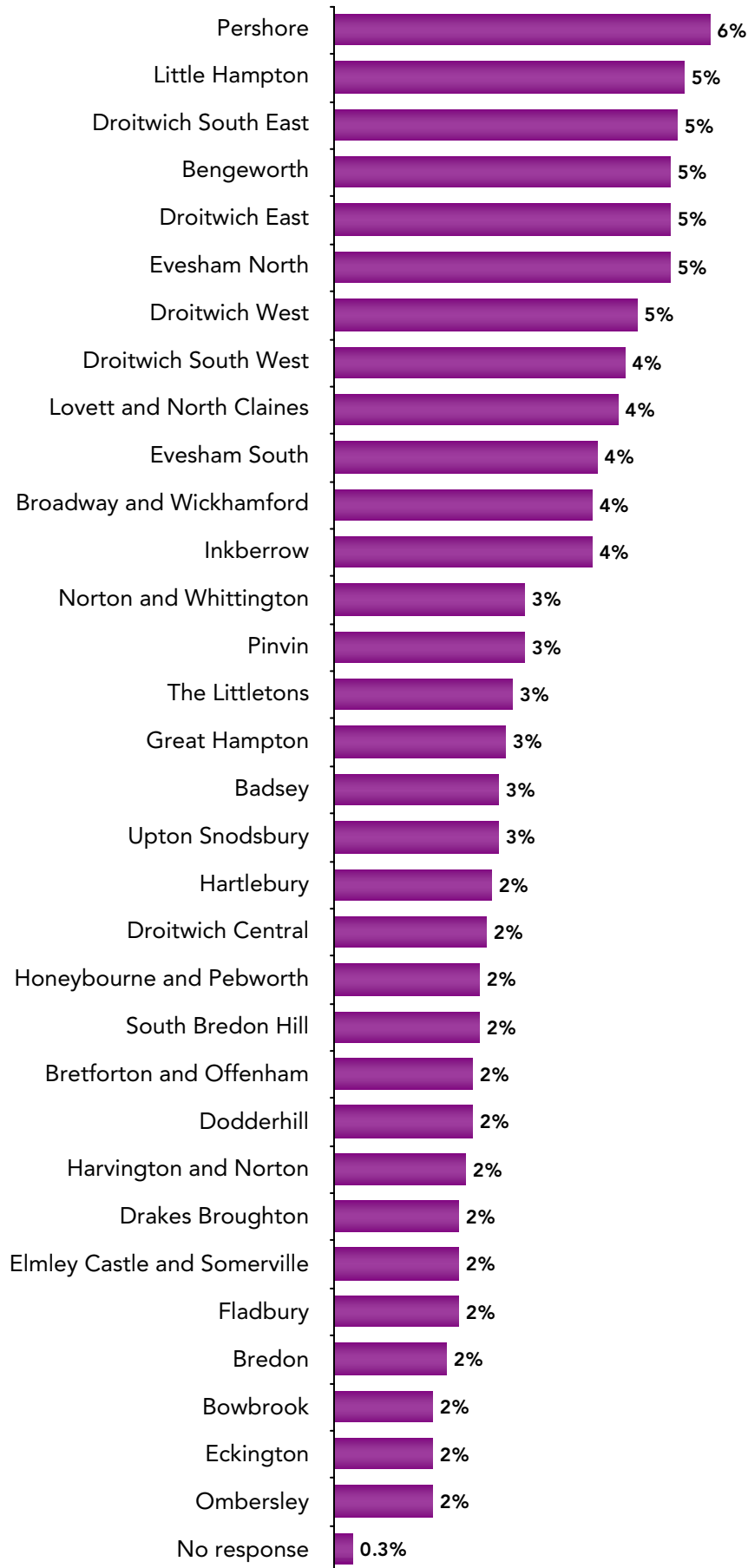

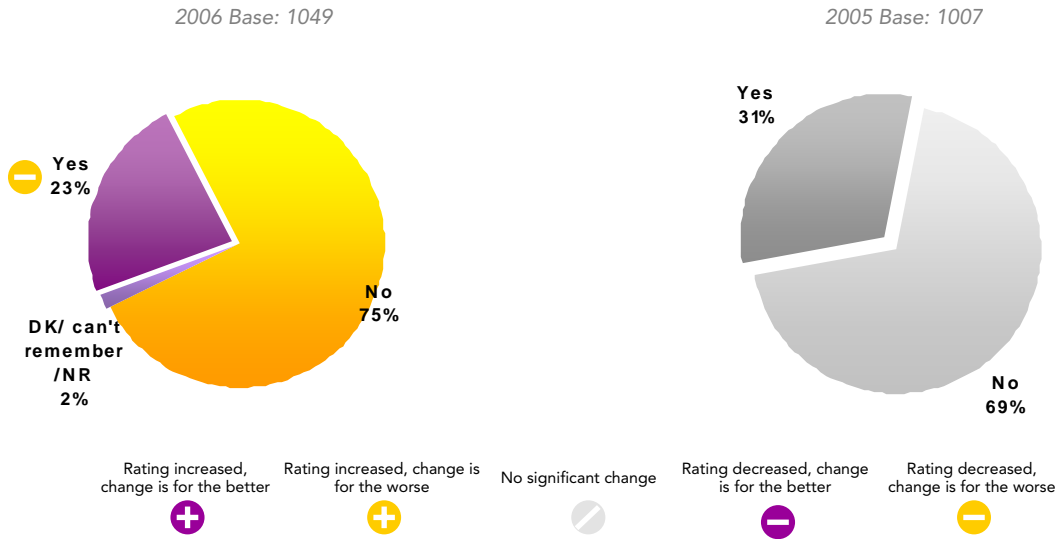

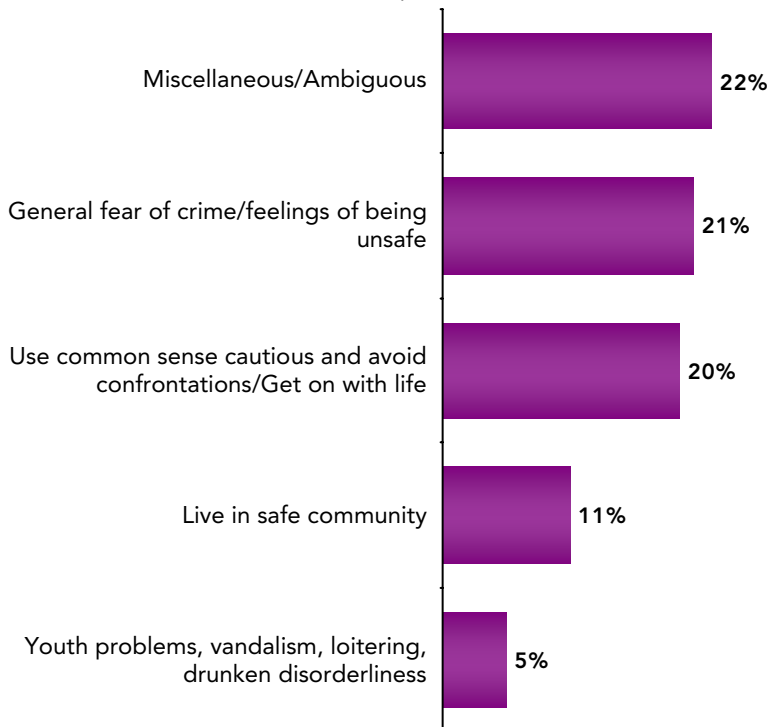

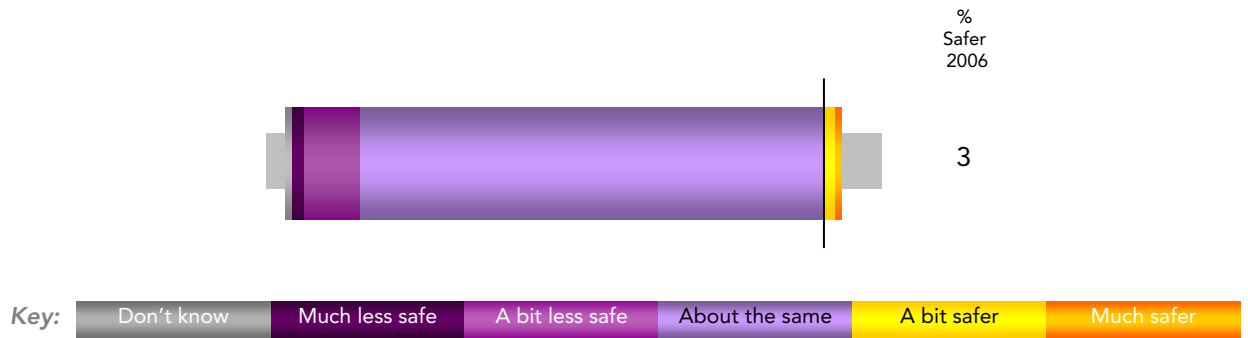

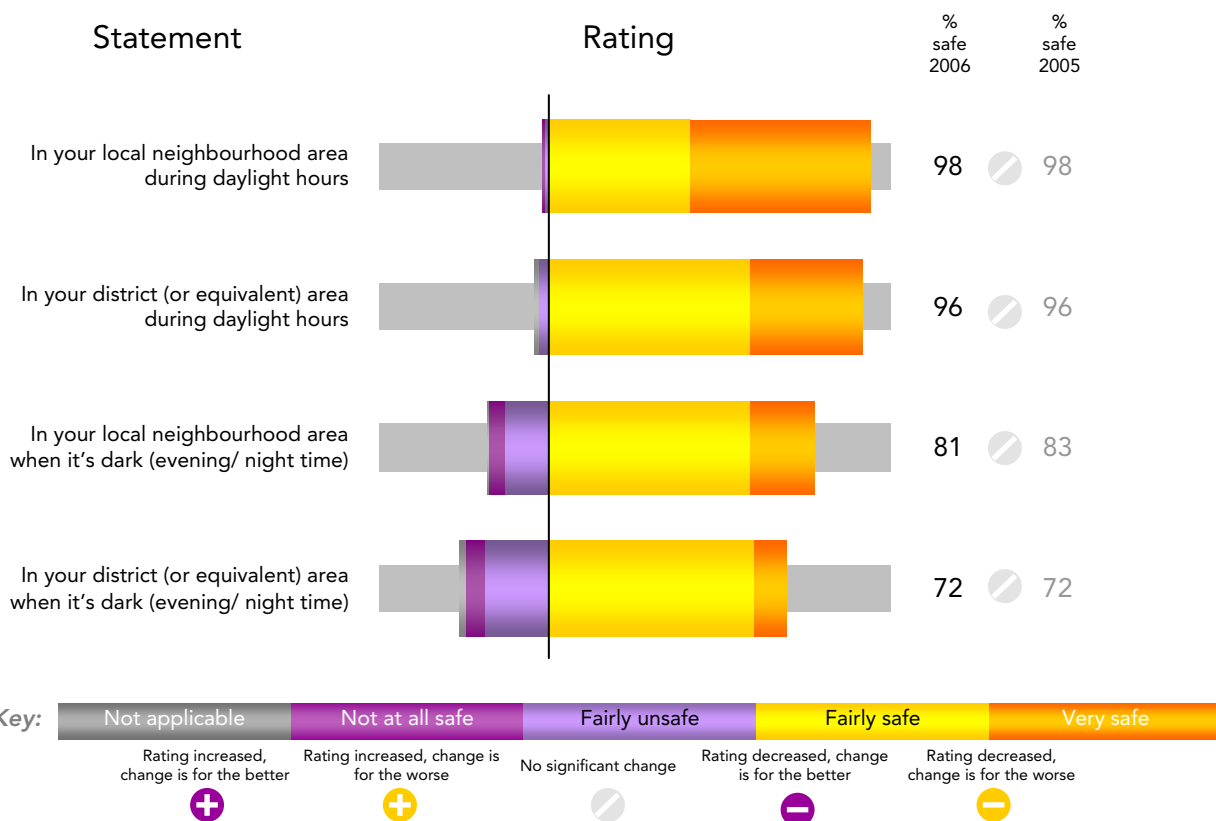

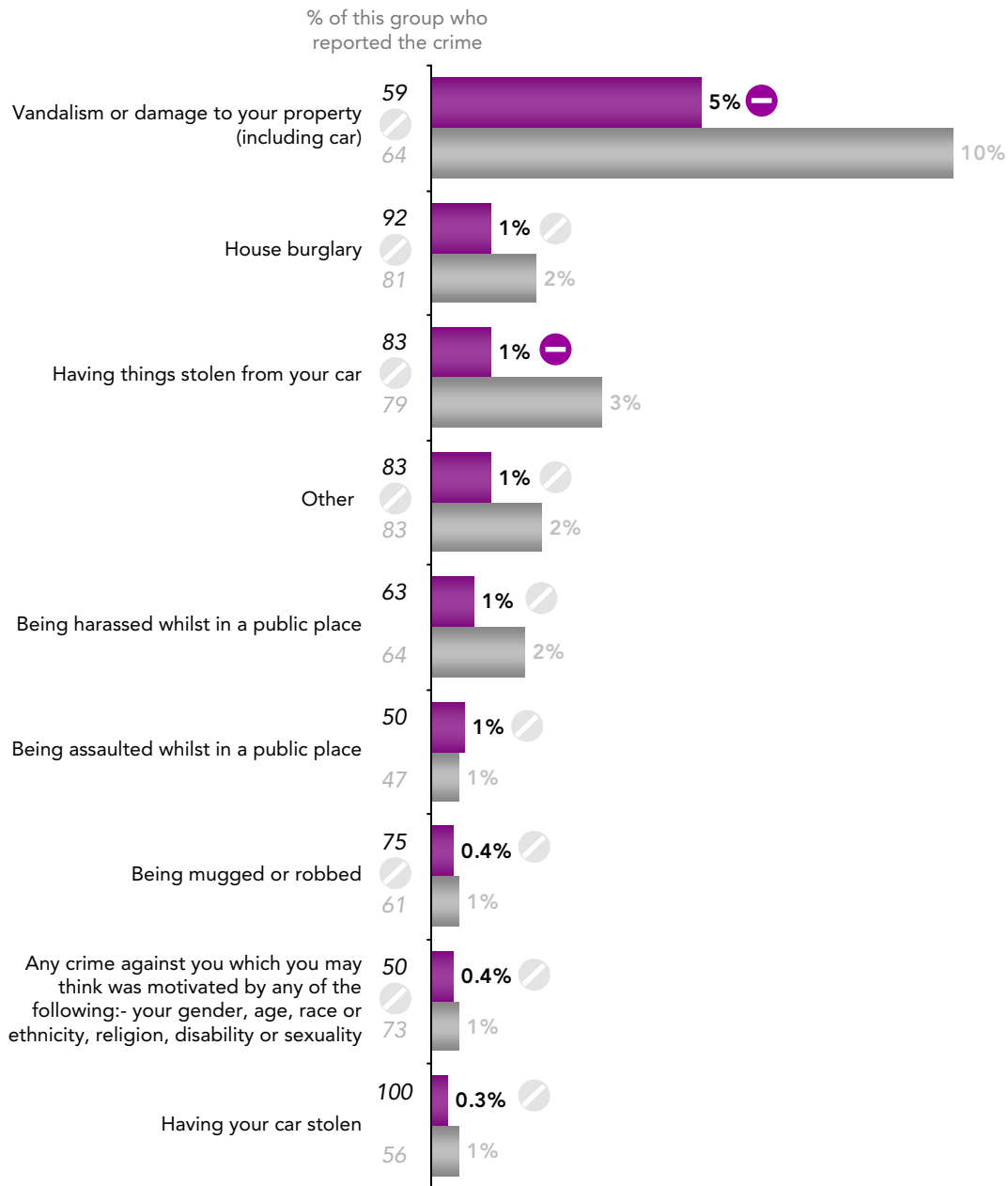

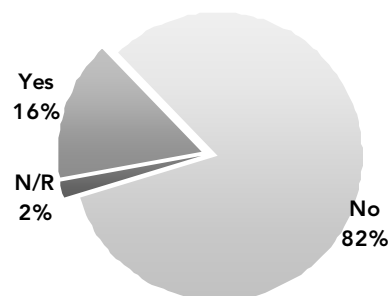

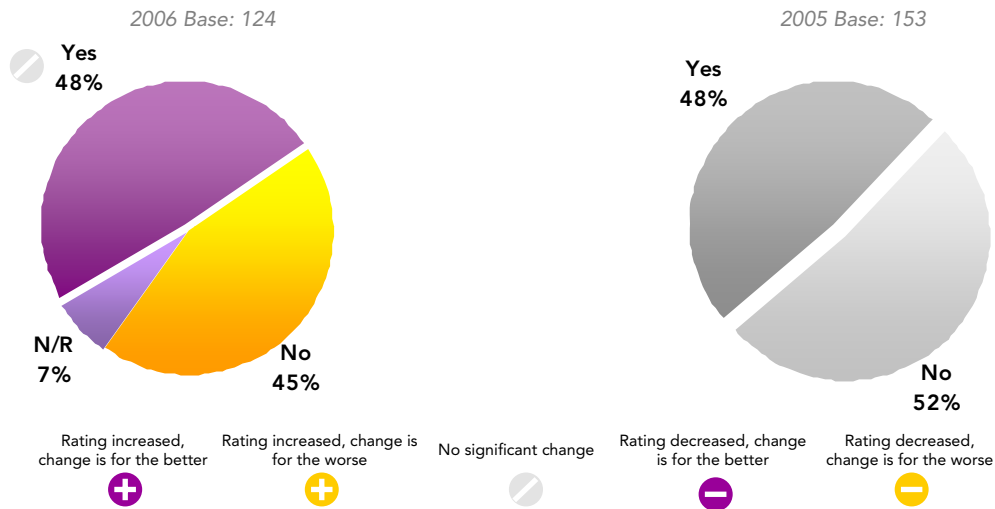

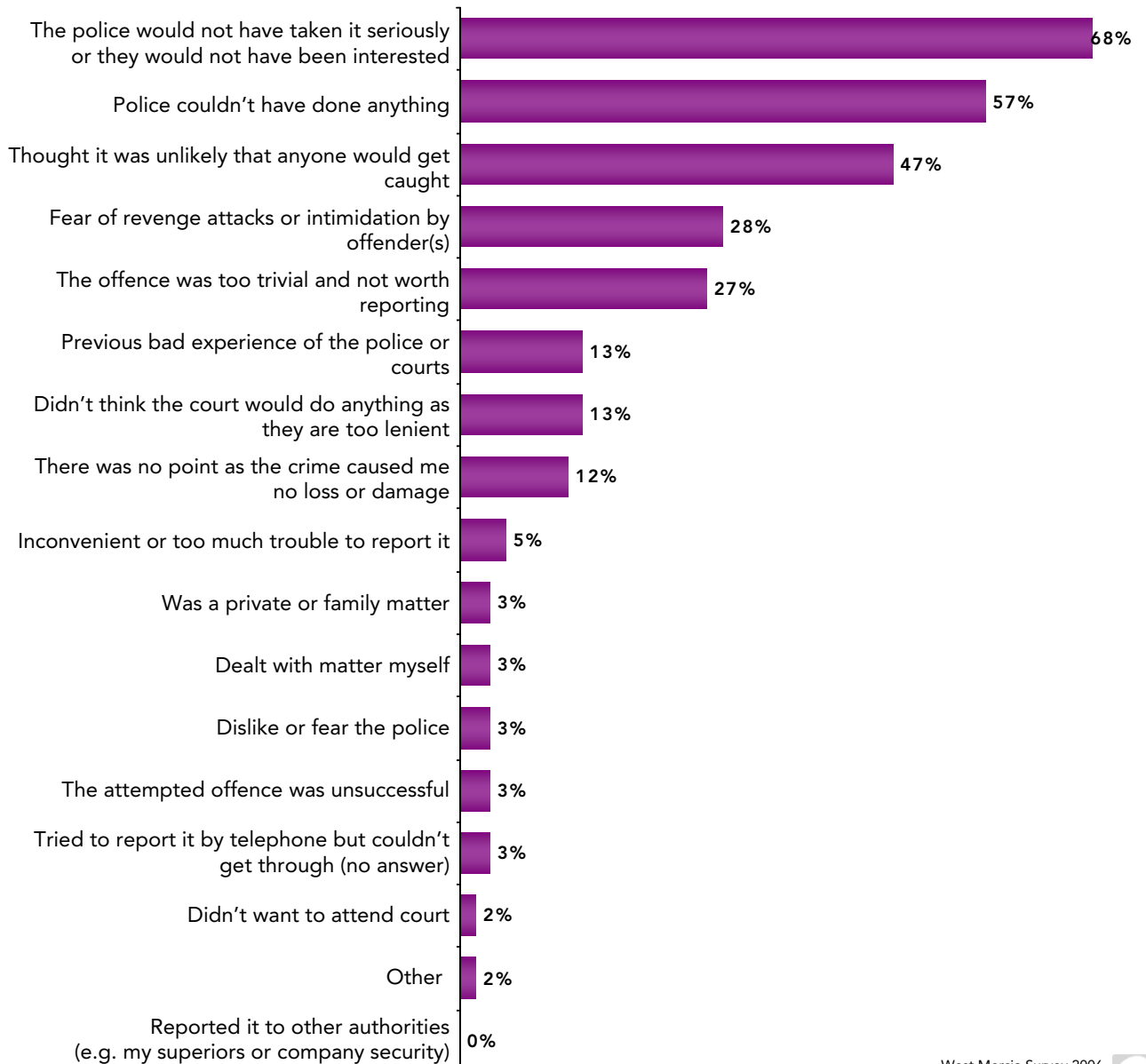

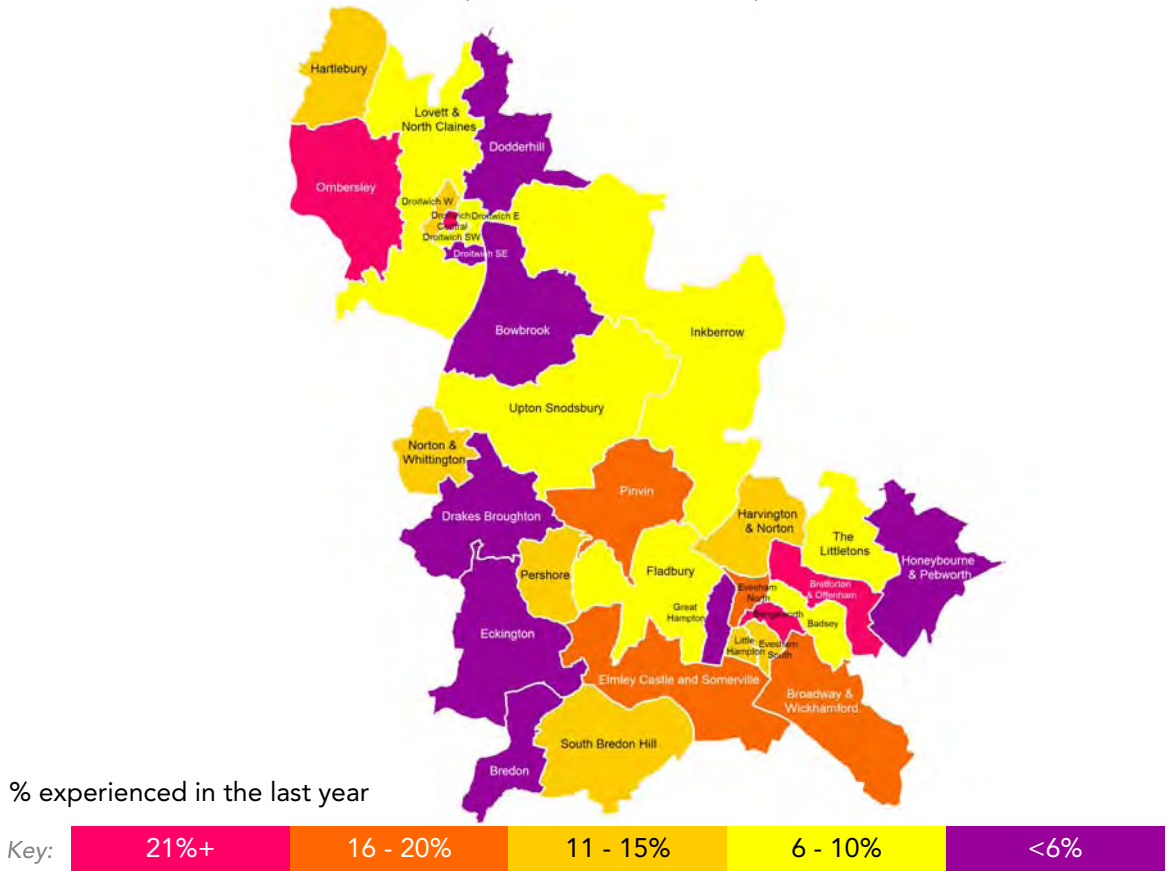

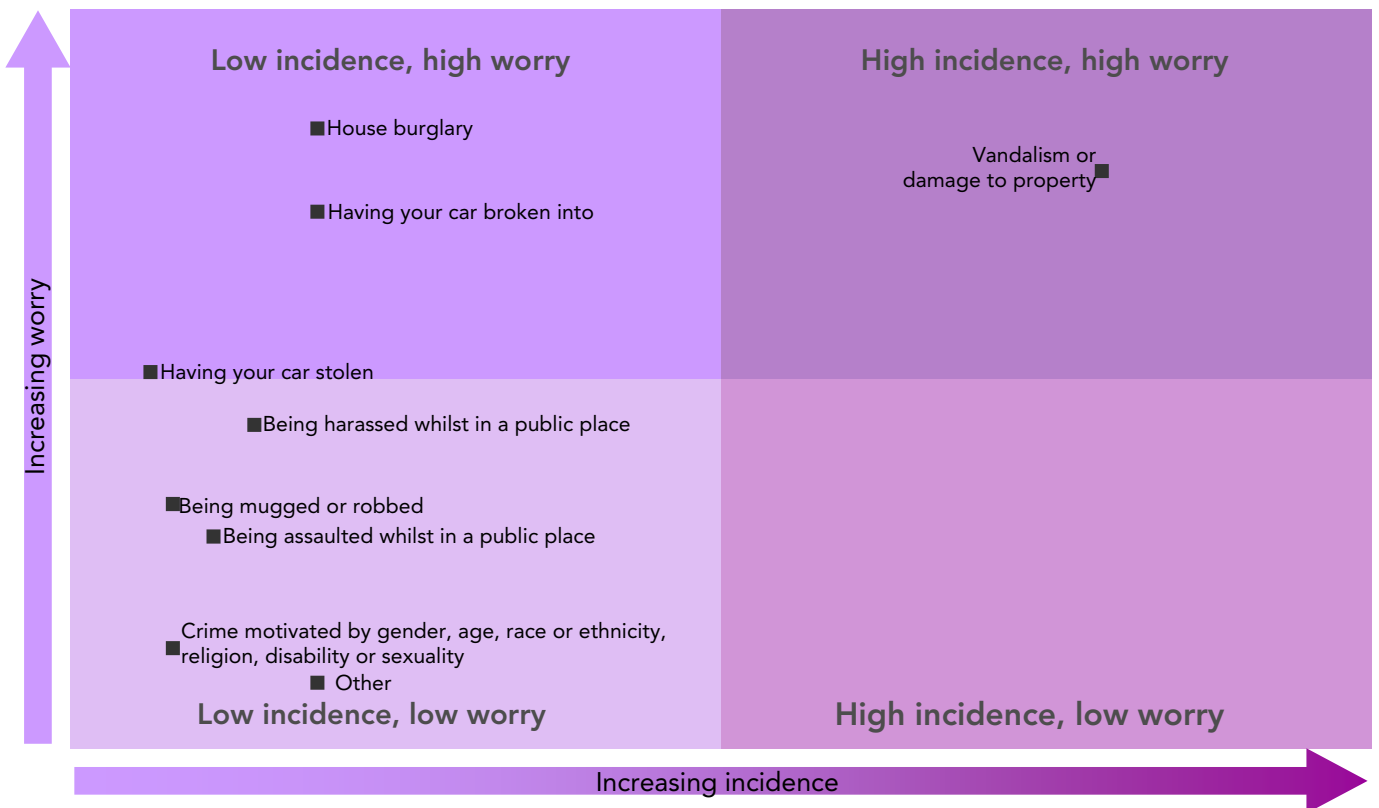

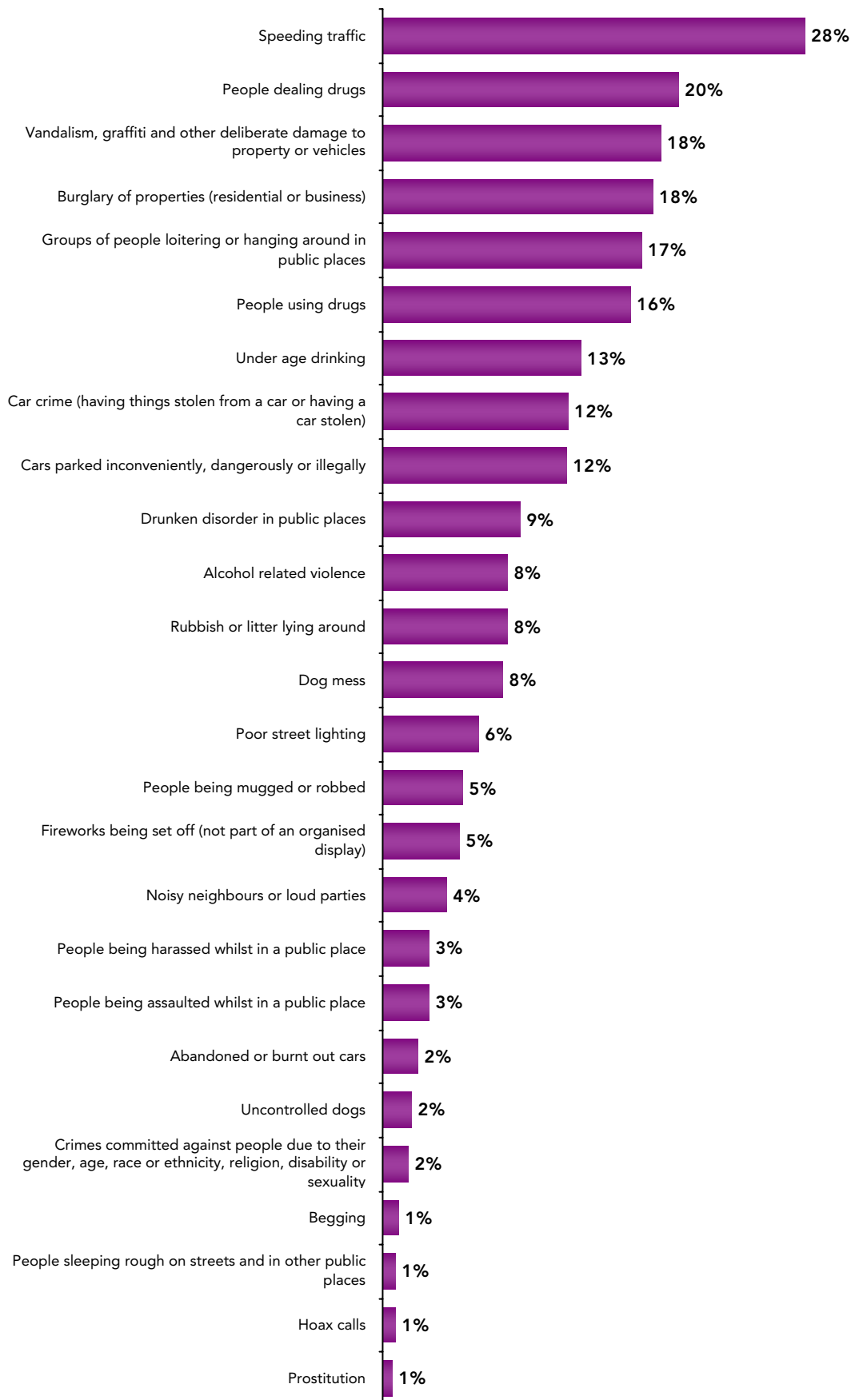

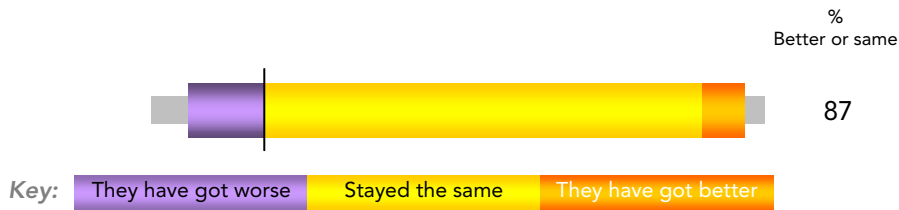

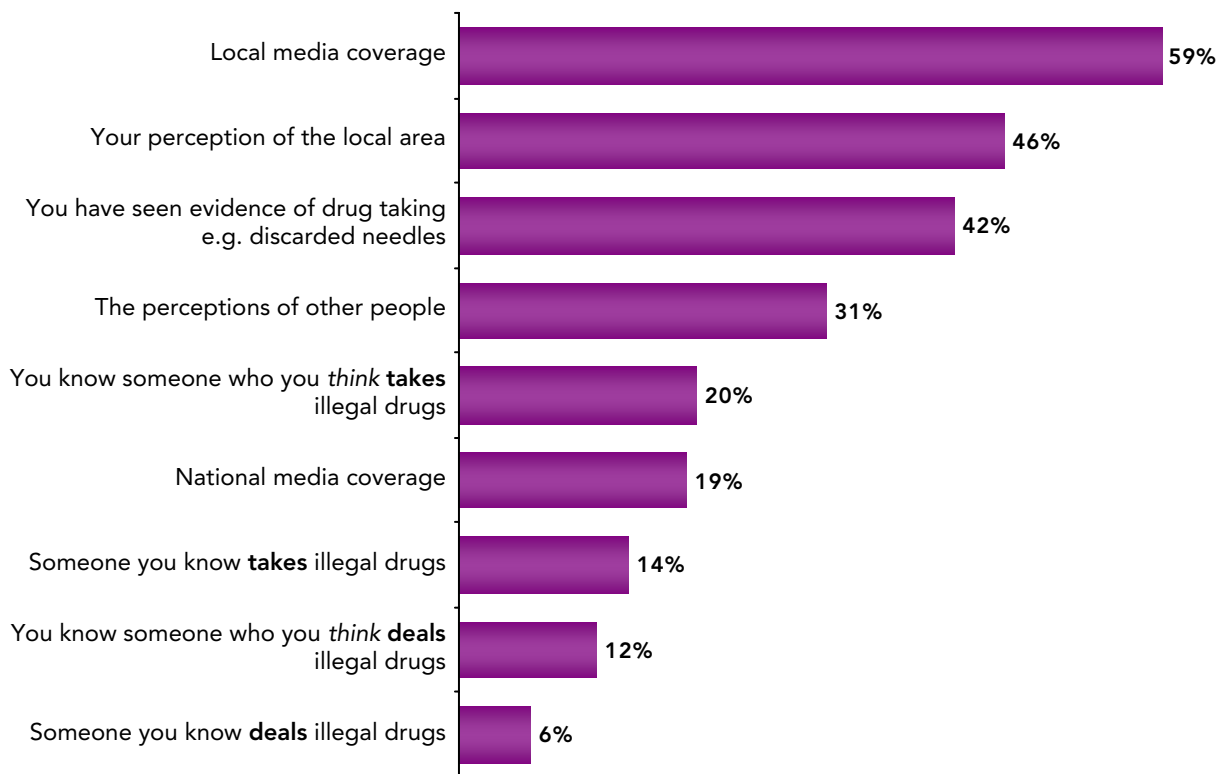

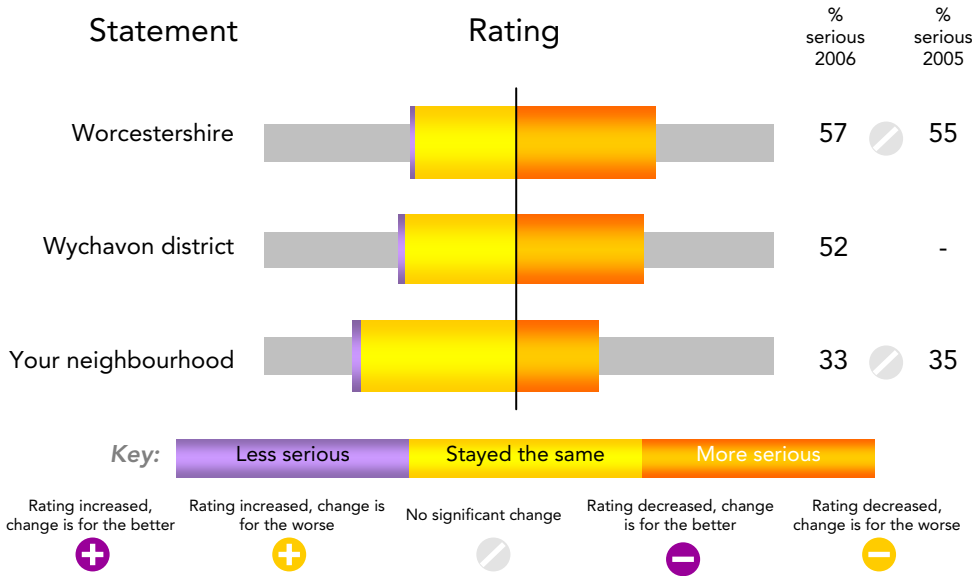

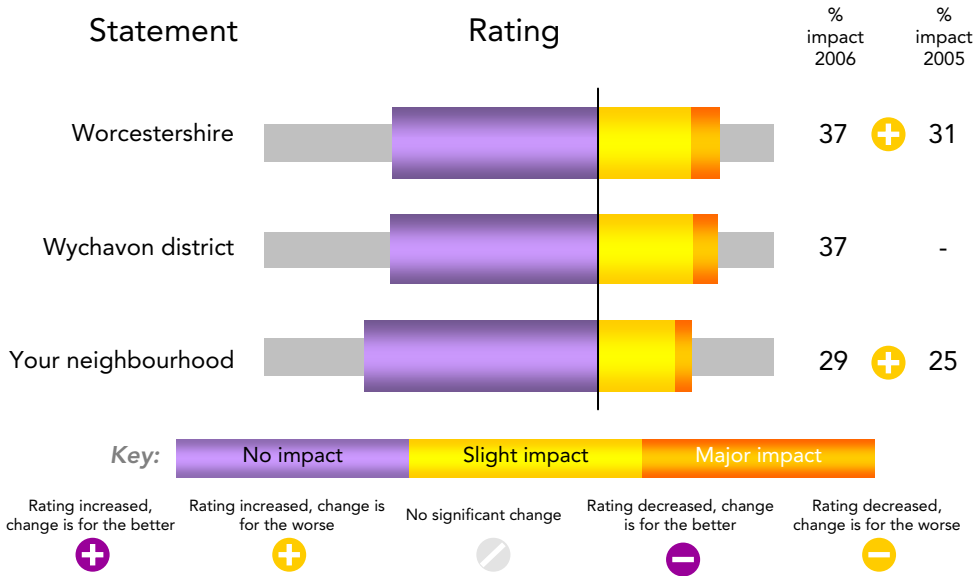

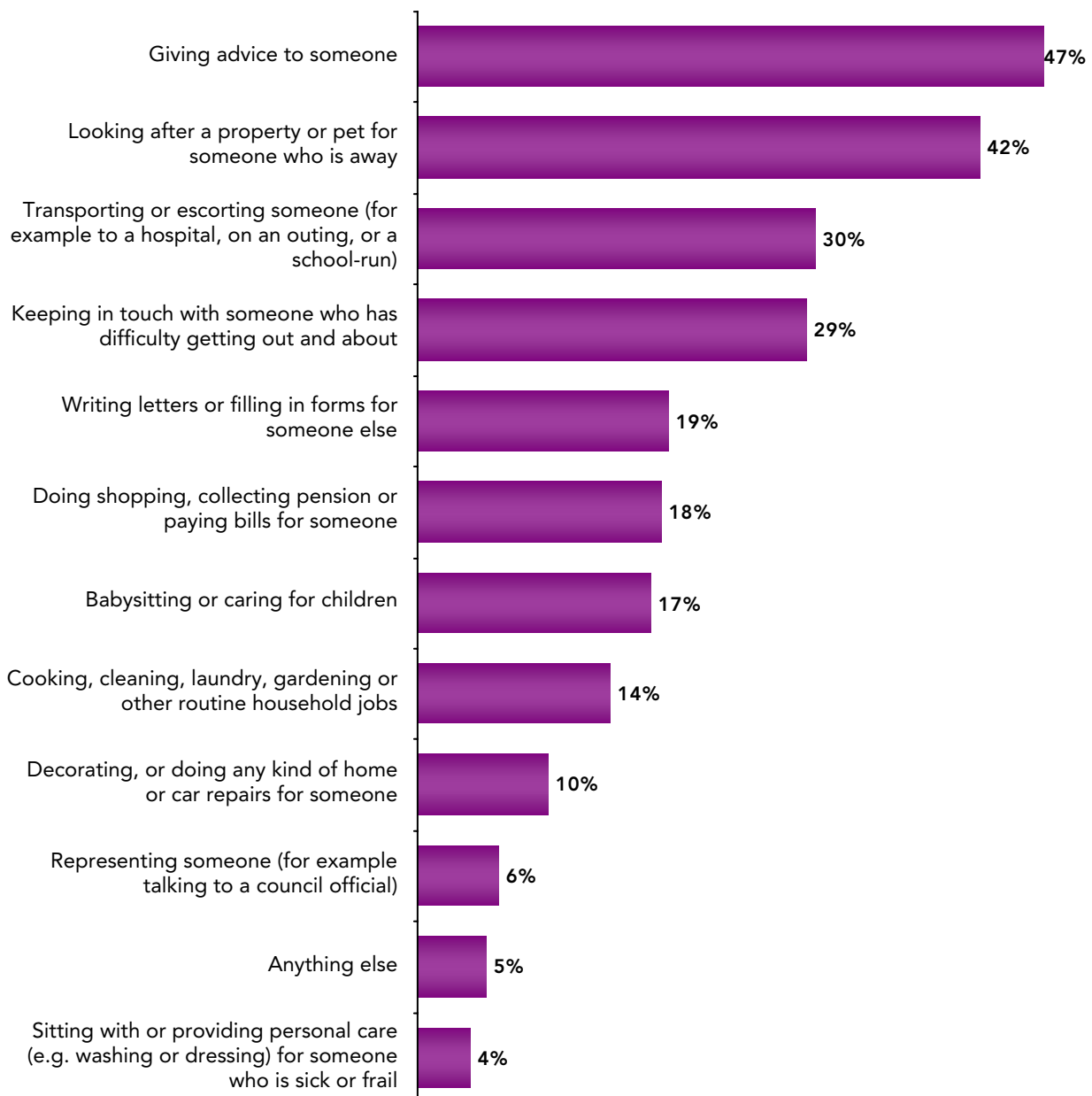

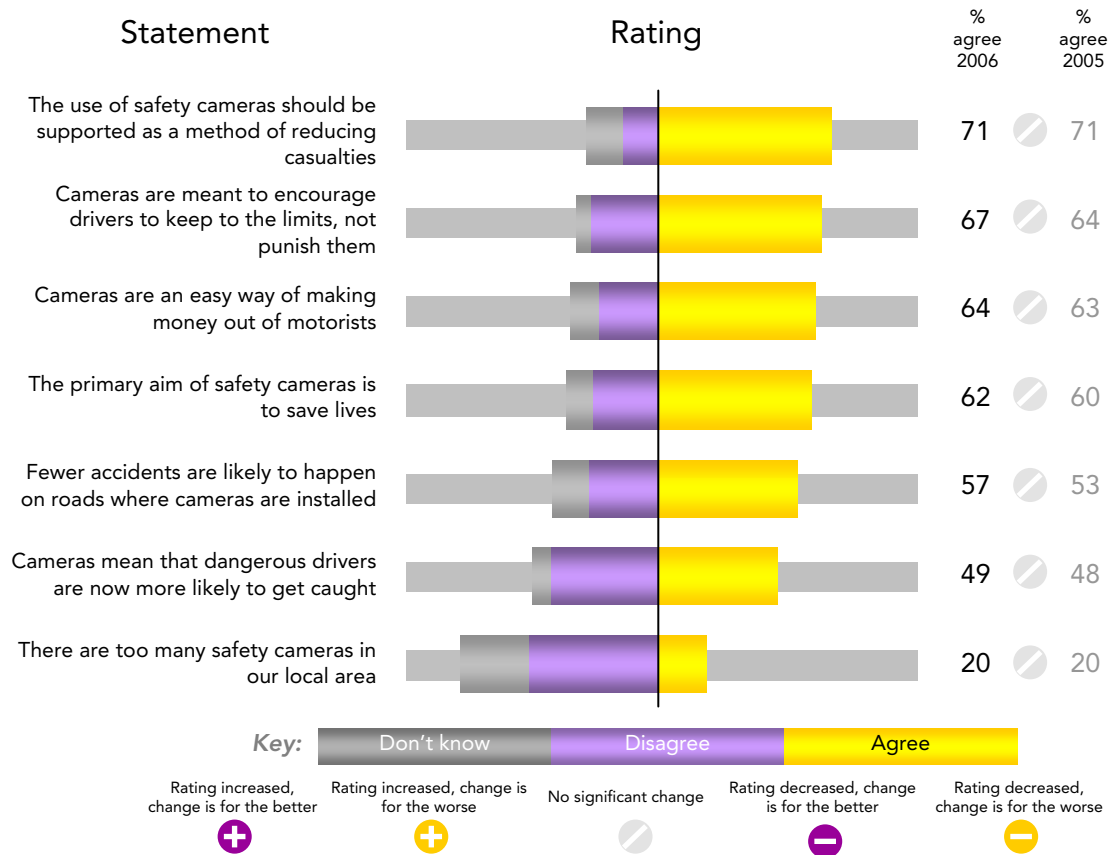

3.14.1 How do you currently find out about crime/police related issues in your area?

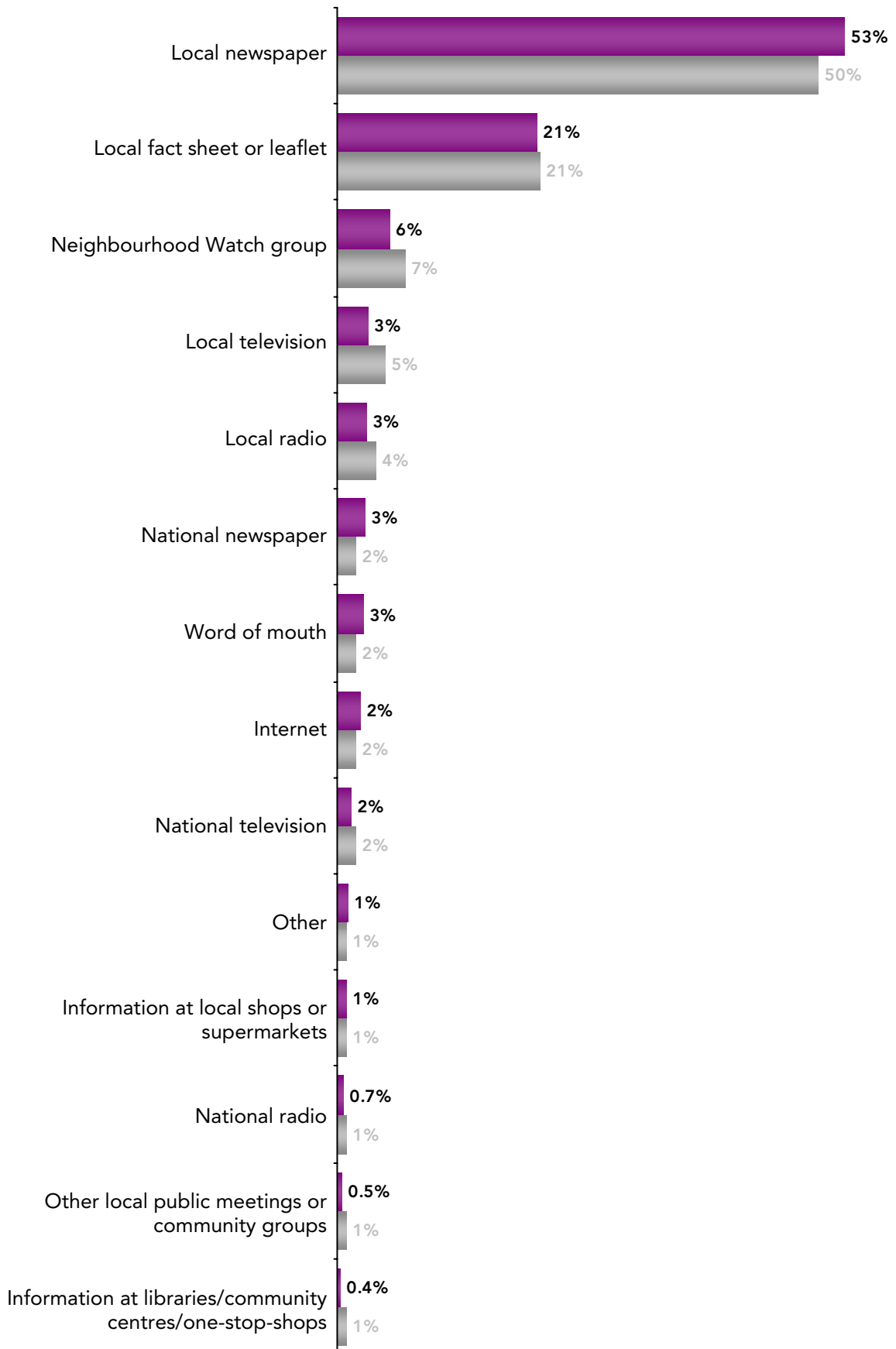

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Appendix I

4.1 Methodology



The Questionnaire

The questionnaire was designed and developed by West Mercia Police, representatives of the 13 districts or unitary authorities and Priority Research based on the 2005 Annual Crime and Community Safety Partnership survey.

The content of the questionnaire included question topics on the police, fear of crime, experience of crime, neighbourhood issues, ASB, drugs misuse, community involvement, road safety, Police and Crime & Disorder information and other district specific topics

Fieldwork

The survey was posted to a random selection of 3800 district residents during July 2006. A freepost envelope was included so that the returns would be delivered directly to PRL, thereby ensuring anonymity. In addition, the survey was available online.

A free prize draw and postcard reminder were also used to encourage the response rate. A sample of 1050 residents successfully completed and returned questionnaires by the closing date, a response rate of 27%.

Analysis

Readers should take care when considering percentage results from some of the sub groups within the main sample, as the base figures may sometimes be small. In addition, due to weighting and rounding effects, some graphs may not add up to 100%.

Unless otherwise stated, all statistically significant differences are reported at the 95% confidence level. Therefore, a difference between two groups is usually considered statistically significant if chance could explain it only 5% of the time or less.

All benchmarking has been conducted against figures previously reported by West Mercia, therefore any comparisons are contingent upon the accuracy of that data.

Weighting

To ensure the results were as representative as possible, the data was weighted by ward, age, gender and ethnicity. Therefore all results are reported for this weighted sample (weighted base: 1049).
