Your Council Tax bill explained

During 2024/25 we will spend about £13.3 million providing services to you. Most of this money comes from Council Tax and Business Rates as well as government grants.



To help protect the services you rely on, and so we can continue to go on improving our district and investing in the things that make a difference to you, from April we are increasing our share of the Council Tax bill by £5*. This means the average band D bill for Wychavon will be £125.08*.

Our part of the Council Tax bill will still be the lowest in Worcestershire and one of the lowest in the country.

Your overall Council Tax bill increase will be higher because you pay Council Tax to five separate organisations - Worcestershire County Council, Wychavon, West Mercia Police and Crime Commissioner, Hereford & Worcester Fire and Rescue Service and usually a town or parish council.

Each organisation charges a different amount of money based on what they need to run their services and can increase their share of the bill, which affects the total amount you pay.

Rather than send you five different bills, we send you one bill on behalf of everyone, collect the money and then send it on to those organisations. The graphic on this page shows how much in every pound you pay to each organisation.

Just 6p in every pound you pay in Council Tax is kept by us, to run everything from rubbish collections to supporting the local economy.

Adult social care charge

Adult social care authorities, in our case Worcestershire County Council, are able to increase their share of the Council Tax bill by an extra amount without holding a referendum. For Worcestershire in 2024/25 this is 2% and is specifically to fund the cost of adult social care and is on top of any increase to fund the day-to-day running of services.

We also have a capital programme and continue to invest in what you have told us is important:

A total of **£34m** to improve roads and **£6m** to improve pavements this year.

walking and cycling improvements include Hampton and Kepax bridges.





£53m on cutting congestion and infrastructure improvements including A38 in Bromsgrove.



£17.3m to improve rail station facilities.





I know the last year has been a difficult one for many. The Council has faced similar challenges too from the impact of inflation on costs and increasing demand for services which have added significantly to our budget pressures.

With more vulnerable people needing our support, and with the cost of this care increasing significantly, we have needed to increase our budget this year to ensure we can continue to provide these essential services

The Government is providing additional funding and we are reforming the way we work to deliver savings and efficiencies. However, this is not enough to meet the budget pressures and therefore we need to increase Council Tax to be able to adequately fund these services.

Our Council Tax will though remain one of the lowest of any comparable County Council in the country.

The additional funding will mean we can continue to deliver vital children's and adult social care to protect the most vulnerable in our society, on which we now spend over 70% of our revenue budget.

It will also enable us to maintain our commitments to invest in the priorities that you have told us are most important. These include better roads and pavements, tackling congestion and improving public transport alongside investments in the economy, environment and extra school places.
