> Dear Mr Singh,

> Having been a resident of Hampton Lovett for over 50 years I am extremely worried about the proposed Housing development on the field between my home in The Forest and the Doverdale Park.

> This field has always been a lovely asset to the rural hamlet, providing a habitat for wildlife and a beautiful setting for our Historic church and the neighbouring houses. It has always been prone to flooding and most wet winters the water will flood over to the A442 causing road closures. Access on to the A442 could also cause traffic problems resulting in possible accidents especially as many drivers do not keep to the speed limit.

> Hampton Lovett is only classed as a hamlet as we have no shop, pub or school so it is a worry how people who are not used to rural living will cope. They will need at least one car per household to get to work, school, shops and entertainment. New residents may find it difficult to register for a doctor or dentist as the practices in Droitwich are already full. Schools may struggle to take more pupils. There is only one High School to serve all Droitwich and the surrounding villages.

> Doverdale Park's residents have chosen to live here for its peaceful, rural setting too. They are going to be surrounded by towering houses so their privacy and peace and quiet they chose for their final home will be taken from them.

> If this development goes ahead the lives of the wildlife and residents and the setting of the Historic church will all be affected and the hamlet's identity will be lost.
