

## **Objections to the development of the field behind Doverdale Park Homes**

To whom it may concern,

I cannot believe that I am having to write this letter so soon after the County Court rejected the plans to develop the land behind and to the side of the Doverdale Park Homes site! It is less than two years since the decision was taken that the site would not be developed! Surely a decision, by the County Court, cannot be overturned in less than two years, or has every objection to this development been annulled; have all the councils and authorities, involved in the earlier decision when they vetoed the plans, now changed their minds to allow the said development to go ahead? Was there no confirmation by the Council, authorising and ratifying the Court decision by official signature, that the case was closed- certainly for the next few years?

Residents on the site have been advised that they cannot re-state the original objections-BUT those objections still stand alongside the objections of the Councils, Severn Trent, Railways and Highways- nothing has changed which would now allow the development to go ahead- or has it??

If we residents have to come up with new details and objections, what new statements have those authorities and the developers produced that would now authorise them to proceed with development against the jurisdiction of the Court?? And how does this fit in with Democracy and Justice?

Furthermore, how is the infrastructure around Hampton Lovatt and Droitwich being developed to cope with the growth in population that more houses will bring- development of existing highways for extra traffic, new surgeries, new places of education etc?

We continue to hope and pray and that this development will not go ahead!

We continue to hope and pray that the authorities which objected before will support the case for no residential development!

We continue to hope and pray that we can have faith in the decision of the Court, the decision of the Councils and other interested authorities, that this application will be vetoed again as a sign of common sense, protection of the environment and concern for the wellbeing of the local residents!
