**Environmental Policy** 

Please use the space below to make comments on this part of the Neighbourhood Plan.

The plan does not contain an environmental policy. The Steering Committee maintain that this is because of time constraints. The lack of transparency by the Steering Committee does not make explicit what these time constraints are. This is a further example of where it appears convenient to not have a policy because it may detract from the Steering Committee's chosen site for development.

One of the Parish Councillors who has lived in the village all of her life has expressed concerns that Springfield Nurseries (The Steering Committee's chosen development site) is the source of a spring which drains into the brook on Winchcombe Road. Building on this land would cause problems with the spring and potentially increase the flood risk to an area of the village that has suffered significant flooding in the last 15 years and many times before that. It doesn't appear that the particular Councillor's comments have been considered.

The plan refers to the Steering Committee's chosen site as an 'eye sore'. This is emotive language designed to influence and nothing could be further from the truth. (See Figures 1)
