Comments on this part of the Neighbourhood Plan

I propose 3 additional green spaces:

1. The path between Low Road and the village hill passes through a long thin field. This field should be a local green space as:

- a) it is reasonably close to Church Lench
- b) it is demonstrably special to Church Lench: the path rises to a stunning view of the Malvern, Abberley, Brown Clee and Titterstone Clees Hills and is peaceful and quiet with wildlife

c) it is local in character: one field by Church Lench

2. The path between Malthouse Close and the Tuer passes through a field. This field should be a local green space as:

a) it is reasonably close to Church Lench

b) it is demonstrably special to Church Lench: the path provides attractive views of the Cotswold Hills and is peaceful and quiet with wildlife

c) it is local in character: one field by Church Lench

3. The path between Malthouse Close (Church Lench) and Atch Lench (over the brook) passes through 2 fields. These 2 fields should be a local green space as:

a) they are reasonably close to Church Lench and Atch Lench

b) it is demonstrably special to Church Lench and Atch Lench: the path provides attractive views of each village and is peaceful and quiet with wildlife

c) it is local in character: 2 fields by Church Lench and Atch Lench

If developers were to build on those fields, it would detract from the villages significantly, which shows that these fields are important local green spaces. I understand that the fields are private, but so, from my understanding, is Church Lench Orchard on Low Road, but that is already a local green space. So I don't think the fields being otherwise private should stop them being designated local green spaces.
